#### IV. <u>Exposure</u>.

Lie: This is my secret.

"One of porn's favorite lies is that this is your secret and that you are the only one who will ever know about it. But haven't you learned that your sin has a way of finding you out? Sin is devious that way. Sin likes to convince you that you are in charge of the situation, that you have control, that you can sin only this much and then stop, that you can sin only this many times and then just cut it off. But that is simply not the nature of sin. I find it helpful to personify sin, to see sin as an evil character who wants to destroy your body, soul, and mind, to wreck your relationships and reputation. Sin wants to destroy everything about you. It wants to dangle a temptation, to see you bite into it, and then to utterly wreck you. Your sin will find you out." - T. Challies
