I. Confronts Jonah (4 & 5).

 Personal growth involves the hard task of <u>examining</u> my own heart.

Psalm 139:23 & 24

- Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxious thoughts;
- And see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way.



II. Exposes Jonah's condition (6-9).



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 Unrighteous anger has a singular <u>focus</u> on <u>self</u>.



III. Reveals what is true about God, but not about Jonah.

Psalm 72:13

He will have compassion on the poor and needy, and the lives of the needy he will save.

Psalm 103:13

Just as a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear Him.

Isaiah 55:7

Let the wicked forsake his way and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return to the LORD, and He will have compassion on him, and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon.

Matthew 14:14

When He went ashore, He saw a large crowd, and felt compassion for them and healed their sick.



III. Reveals what is true about God, but not about Jonah.
