(Part I of Psalm 1)




I Corinthians 15:3 & 4

- 4 and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures,



James 1:12


¹² Blessed is a man who perseveres under trial; for once he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which *the Lord* has promised to those who love Him.

- 15 Therefore be careful how you walk,
not as unwise men but as wise,
- 16 making the most of your time,
because the days are evil.
