The Bible never sets out to prove or argue for God's existence, it simply declares, "in the beginning God" (Genesis 1:1). According to the Scriptures there is no such thing as an honest atheist, "For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, **have been clearly seen** (emphasis mine),.....so that they are without excuse." (Romans 1:20). The result of the fall is that man is hostile toward God, seeks to be God and reinvent God. This is why in the religions of today's world there are many so-called gods and just as many opinions about what God (or god) is like.

I. God's Self-Revelation in the Scriptures

In the Old Testament Scripture records God revealing Himself by the following means:

- Creation primarily through man, made in God's image.
- Angels.

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- Signs, wonders, and miracles.
- Vision, dreams.
- Words spoken by prophets and others.
- Written Old Testament Scripture.

In the New Testament God revealed Himself in the Scriptures similarly but more fully:

- The God-man Jesus Christ, very image of God.
- Angels
- Signs, wonders, and miracles.
- Spoken words by Apostles and Prophets.
- Written New Testament Scriptures.

II. God's Character and Attributes

An attribute is a characteristic or quality of that which is true about someone. Because of the infinite nature of God we are limited in our finite comprehension of Him, yet our greatest quest remains an ever increasing understanding of what the Scripture reveals about God.

The Scriptures reveal to us that God is spirit (John 4:24), perfect in all His attributes, one in essence, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19) – each equally deserving worship and obedience. The following are just a few of His attributes. As you look-up the following passages, write down that part of the verse that describes the given attribute.
