Salvation is of the Lord (Jonah 2:9). Salvation is not a human enterprise. Human beings cannot save themselves, it is a Divine work accomplished and applied by God. Salvation is both of the Lord and from the Lord. It is the Lord who saves the sinner from God's wrath (John 3:36).

Salvation is:

- By Grace alone (*Sola Gratia*)
- Through Faith alone (*Sola Fide*)
- Because of Christ alone (*Sola Christus*)

4. Conversion (faith and repentance).
5. Justification (right legal standing).
6. Adoption (membership in God's family).
7. Sanctification (right conduct of life).
8. Perseverance (remaining a Christian).
9. Death (going to be with the Lord).
10. Glorification (receiving a resurrection body).
