Memorize -

✓ Matthew 28:19 & 20 - Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.

Jesus said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." (John 14:15). The Great Commission given by the resurrected Savior is a command to make disciples and baptize them. It is every Christian's duty to follow Christ in obedience to this command. The Book of Acts gives evidence of how the early Christians understood and followed Christ's instruction to mark converts by their submitting to baptism.

Sometimes referred to as a sacrament (a visible sign of an invisible grace) or an ordinance (a command to be practiced and perpetuated by the church until Christ returns), baptism serves as a witness of the believer's faith in Christ and union with Him.

IV. Baptism as Identification with Christ

Romans 6:3 & 4 declares that the believer is baptized into Christ. This baptism is rightly called spirit baptism (cp. I Cor. 12:13). Water baptism is a picture of what has happened in spirit baptism – spiritually immersing the believer into identification with the death, burial and resurrection of Christ.
