I. God's Will

The Bible sets forth two aspects of God's will: His sovereign (decreed) will that relates to His rule and control over all things, His command (desired) will that is revealed throughout the Scriptures as laws or directives.

A. God's Sovereign Will

It has been well said that God plans His work and works His plan. Nothing happens that is not in His plan. History is the unfolding of God's purposes which happen according to His preordained plan.
