If, therefore....no one can pay except God, and no one ought to pay except man: it is necessary that a God-man should pay it. Therefore, Jesus Christ, the God-man, is the only one who can offer satisfaction for the sin of humanity!" - G. Allison, History of Theo.

"Was there any other way for God to save human beings than by sending his Son to die in our place? Before answering this question, it is important to realize that it was not necessary for God to save people at all. When we appreciate that 'God did not spare the angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to pits of darkness to be kept until the judgment' (2 Peter 2:4), then we realize that God could also have chosen to save no one, just as He did with the sinful angels. So, in this sense the atonement was not absolutely necessary. But once God, in His love, decided to save some human beings, then several passages in Scripture indicate that there was no other way for God to do this than through the death of His Son." – W. Grudem, Sys. Theo.
